Capella's EdS in School Psychology program will meet the state's requirements for professional licensure if certain conditions are fulfilled.</p> <p>Wyoming accepts an applicant who holds a valid certification as a Nationally Certified School Psychologist (NCSP) awarded by the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP).</p> <p>Capella's MS in School Psychology and Capella's EdS in School Psychology prepares graduates of these programs with the required graduate 90 quarter credit hours in school psychology and required 1,200 internship hours needed to meet NCSP credentialing standards. Learners admitted into Capella's EdS program with a master's in school psychology degree or a master's in psychology with a specialization in school psychology degree from an institution other than Capella will need to work with their enrollment counselor or academic advisor to determine if there is an appropriate plan of study.</p> <p>Capella learners must pass the Praxis exam to be eligible to apply for the NCSP credential.</p> <p>Capella's Eds in School Psychology program is designed around NCSP standards; Capella's Eds in School Psychology program is not NASP approved. For graduates of non-NASP approved programs, NCSP applications are accepted twice a year: May 1 and November 1. The application involves preparing a case study and demonstrating competency in 10 domains of practice. The review process takes approximately 3 to 4 months. Resubmission with corrections is not uncommon.</p> <p>Once the NCSP credential has been granted, graduates may apply for the state license.</p> <p>Please be aware that applicants to all exams (PRAXIS and state-specific), state licenses, and the NCSP credential will incur additional associated fees.</p> <p><u>Professional Services Endorsement for School Psychologist awarded by the Wyoming Professional Teaching Standards Board (PTSB)</u></p> <p>Wyoming regulations indicate Capella's EdS in School Psychology program will not meet the state requirements for professional licensure.</p> <p>Wyoming requires school psychologist applicants to hold a Wyoming Educator License.
